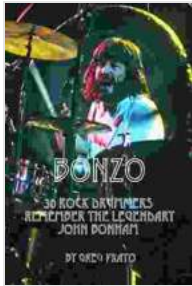

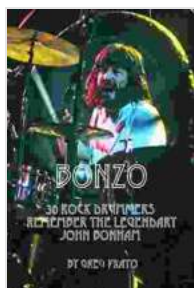


John Bonham

John Bonham was born in Redditch, Worcestershire, England, on May 31, 1948. He began playing drums at the age of five, and by the time he was a teenager, he was playing in local bands. In 1968, he joined Led Zeppelin, and the rest is history.
