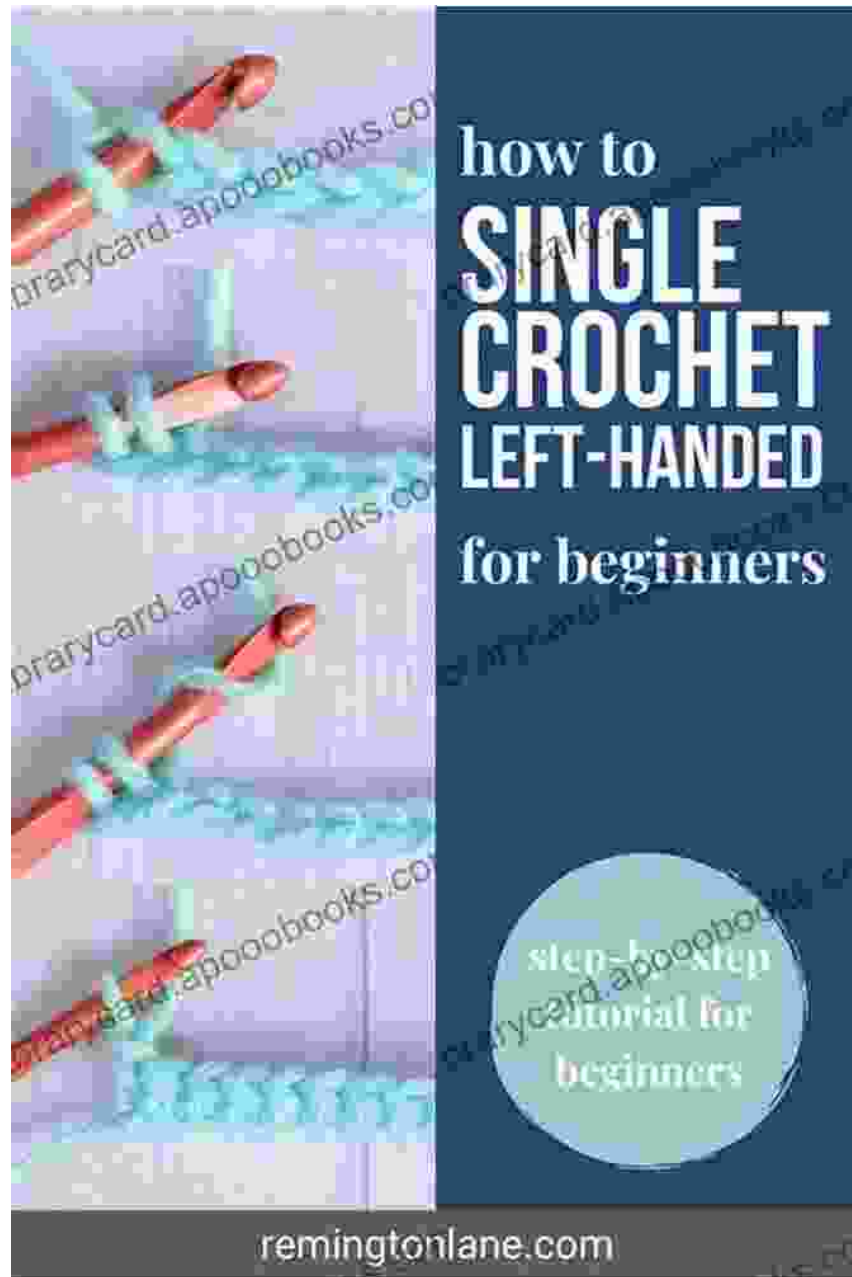
## Holding the Hook and Yarn
