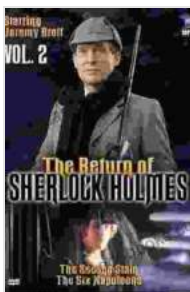


The Return of Sherlock Holmes: A Masterpiece of Deductive Reasoning
